Guidelines for COVID safety The Bishops of England and Wales have issued guidance for the time ahead, emphasising the importance of continuing “to create a safe environment in places of worship.” For example, churches should continue to provide sanitiser at entrances and exits, continue the signing-in for acts of worship, no restriction on the numbers allowed for weddings and funerals other than determined by the size of the church and the safety of those attending. With the other Bishops, Bishop Terry now strongly recommends that we maintain the wearing of masks, social distancing, the service of stewards, and continue the high standard of sanitising the churches that we have so far employed. “When it is felt at local level that restrictions can be eased, this should be done gradually, taking into account the state of the spread of the virus and its effects on the local community, society in general and the NHS.”
